"Put out into deep water and let down the nets for a catch"

Luke 5:4 (from "Morning by Morning" by Charles Spurgeon)

We learn from this narrative, the necessity of human means. The catch of fish was miraculous, yet neither the fisherman nor his boat nor his fishing tackle were ignored, but all were used to take the fishes. Similarly, God works by means in saving souls. While the present grace stands, God will be pleased by the foolishness of preaching to save them that believe. 1130 When God works without means, doubtless He is glorified. but He has Himself selected the plan of using means as being that by which He is most magnified in the earth. Means by themselves are totally useless. "Master, we've worked hard all night and haven't caught anything."1131 What was the reason of this? They were experienced fisherman and understood the work. Had they lacked perseverance? No, they had toiled all the night. Was there a lack of fish in the sea? Certainly not, for as soon as the Master came, they swam to the net in large groups. What, then, is the reason? It's because there's no power in the means themselves without the presence of Christ. Without Him we can do nothing, 1132 but with Him we can do everything. 1133 Christ's presence confers success. Jesus sat in Peter's boat, and by His will drew the fish to the net. When Jesus is lifted up in His Church, His presence is the Church's power—"I, when I am lifted up from the earth, will draw all men to myself."1134 If we lift up Jesus Christ in our work of soul fishing, we won't work in vain, for He will fill our nets with fishes.
